## Thoughts from Pastor Landskroener

November is a month for remembering. It starts with All Saints' Day on November 1 when we remember the saints who now rest from their labors. On November 10, Veterans Day, we remember those who have served in our armed forces. Also, not to be overlooked, it's Martin Luther's birthday. On November 24 we celebrate the end of another Church Year and remember the gifts of grace we've received even as we look forward to Christ's return in glory and judgment. And on Thanksgiving Eve (November 27) at 7:00 pm, we remember and give thanks for the many blessings we have received from God, and from others.

Now, I can't talk about all of these in one article, but I would like to draw your attention to All Saints' Day, which we will celebrate on Saturday, November 2, and Sunday, November 3. And what a wondrous day it is! In fact, the Lutheran Confessions give us three reasons to honor them. The first honor is thanksgiving: "We should thank God for showing examples of his mercy, revealing his will to save men, and giving teachers and other gifts to the church. . . . The second honor is the strengthening of our faith: when we see Peter forgiven after his denial, we are encouraged to believe that grace does indeed abound more than sin (Rom. 4:20). The third honor is the imitation, first of their faith and then of their other virtues, which each should imitate in accordance with his calling." (Ap XXI, Tappert 229-230).

So as we celebrate All Saints' Day, we celebrate the blessings of God on all the saints of the Holy Christian Church who have been freed by death from this vale of tears. They have entered their rest in Christ, even as they await their resurrection! Their gift of eternal life that began in baptism continues even in the grave and will find its fulfillment when our Lord Jesus returns to raise them from the dead. These saints include the saints of old as well as our loved ones who have died in the faith and now rest from their labors. Hymn 679 "Oh, How Blest Are They" beautifully describes the joy of the day:

#### Oh, How Blest Are They

- Oh, how blest are they whose toils are ended, Who through death have unto God ascended! They have arisen
   From the cares which keep us still in prison.
  - We are still as in a dungeon living,
     Still oppressed with sorrow and misgiving;
     Our undertakings
     Are but toils and troubles and heartbreakings
  - 3. They meanwhile are in chambers sleeping,
    Quiet and set free from all their weeping;
    No cross or sadness
    There can hinder their untroubled gladness
  - 4. Christ has wiped away their tears forever;
    They have that for which we still endeavor.
    By them are chanted
    Songs that ne'er to mortal ears were granted.
  - Come, O Christ, and loose the chains that bind us;
     Lead forth and cast this world behind us
     With You the Anointed,
     Finds the soul its joy and rest appointed

Now, as we celebrate and honor the saints, we remember that they are not angels. They have not received their wings. The Bible doesn't say they watch over us. So we certainly don't worship them or pray to them, but it is still quite proper to honor those who have gone before us into the Kingdom of Glory. However, we have no command from God to pray to them or any promise that they hear us. We also do not trust in their merits or good works for anything, and

we do not trust in them to get us to heaven. For they did not die for our sins and we are not accounted righteous for their sakes. That honor belongs to Christ Jesus alone, for He is the only One through whom we are certain that our sins are forgiven. He is the only One whose death is sufficient sacrifice for our sins. He is the only One whose merits benefit us since He is the only One to have kept and fulfilled God's Law perfectly. He is the only One through whom we pray to our heavenly Father.

So even as we honor the saints, we "thank, praise, serve, and obey" our Lord who gave them forgiveness of sins, eternal life, and salvation even as He gives them to us.

And this why the Divine Service is so important for us. Indeed, it is central to the Christian life. After all, when we celebrate the Sacrament of the Altar, we join with the "angels and archangels and the whole company of heaven" standing in God's presence, singing His

praises, and giving Him all honor and glory. We also rejoice to receive from Him the Body and Blood of Jesus for the forgiveness of sins. In that blessed Meal we get a foretaste of the feast to come. So as we participate in the liturgy by receiving God's gifts of forgiveness, life, and salvation through His Word and Sacrament, and responding with prayers and hymns of honor and praise, we are rehearsing for that great feast which will have no end. What we do now prepares us for what we will do for eternity.

God grant that each of us so rejoice in honoring and communing with the saints that we wouldn't miss any opportunity to do so. God bless your All Saints' Day celebration

#### **Newsletter Article – November 2019**

St. Paul wrote to the Church of Christ in Corinth: "Each one must give as he has decided in his heart, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver" (2 Cor 9:7). *God loves a cheerful giver*. But who is a cheerful giver?

Abel was. By faith, Abel gave the firstborn of his flock, and it was acceptable in God's sight. Abraham was. By faith, Abraham prepared cakes and a tender choice calf for God and entertained angels unaware. So also were David and Solomon. By faith, David would not make a sacrifice to God that cost him nothing, so he paid Araunah his due. By faith, Solomon built a house for God, where his name would dwell and thereby where He would dwell to be Israel's God and they His people.

What more shall I say? For time would fail me to tell of all those who gave not simply for the joy of giving but for the joy of knowing the One to whom they gave.

So also our Lord, who for the joy set before Him, gave everything, yes, even His life, enduring the cross and scorning its shame. He gave to the shedding of His blood, willingly and resolutely setting His face toward

Jerusalem to die for the life of the world. Though He was rich in every way, He became poor, so that by His poverty we might be rich beyond measure.

So then, let us – like Abel and Abraham, like David and Solomon, and even like our Lord Jesus Christ – give cheerfully to God for the work of His kingdom in our midst. Like them, let us decide in our heart – for the joy set before us – the joy of knowing the One to whom we give is the One who gives us all good things.

## Box Tops for Education

Box Tops for Education has a new process for submitting box tops. This is great news for our school as it will eliminate the extra cost of supplies and postage! There is a Box Top app in the App Store on your phone. If you're comfortable with downloading this app, once you've made a purchase at any store that participates in the BTFE program, simply open the app on your phone and scan the receipt. The school will immediately receive credit for any qualifying purchases. Your receipt must be scanned within 14 days of purchase. If you do not wish to download the app, you may leave your receipt at school where it can be scanned and then returned to you if needed.

Box Tops may still be clipped and turned in to school until this method is phased out. We are able to "double dip" during this time so even if you scan your receipt, you can still clip these box tops.

We will continue the Box Top Hero monthly contest. In order to keep track of individual box tops sent it, please continue to send in Box Tops in a baggie with the student's name written on it. If you send your receipt to school to be scanned, please write your student's name on the receipt. If you are scanning your own Box Tops please take a screen shot once you receive confirmation showing the amount earned for the school. With the first month and a half of school under our belts, things are starting to settle down for the little people in preschool 3 and prekindergarten 4. Our preschool 3 classes, sporting a bible-based curriculum, have covered the Old Testament stories of creation through the birth of Issac. We're currently learning about Joseph and his brothers. Much like a bible study, we examine how the stories relate to our lives and the world around us, using these examinations to further our social and emotional development. Unlike a bible study, we also relate the stories to our bi-weekly letters!

Many of our prekindergarten 4 classmates are old pros at the school routine by now, and we've not only managed to learn our letters Aa-Dd, but we've also read the stories of various Old Testament figures, including the lesson behind Jacob and Esau. We brought in our family pictures to display in our classroom so that we can talk to our classmates about the people who love us, and we even brought our own baby photos to compare ourselves then and now!

The entire school went to Willoughby Farm in late September, and we all enjoyed a great nature walk, petting and feeding the farm animals, crafting, and taking a wagon ride. It was fantastic to attend a field trip with the older students, as the little ones very much enjoy spending time with them. One of the highlights of the week for the smaller preschool 3 class is spending just a half hour eating snacks and having play time with Mr. Lingel's 7th and 8th grade class each Friday morning. The students at St. Paul's from the youngest to the oldest really behave like a family, and it's wonderful to see that on display when all of them are together. I'm so excited to see what the rest of the year will bring!
