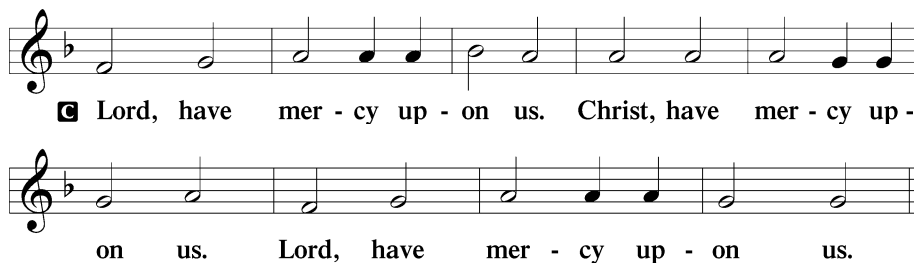

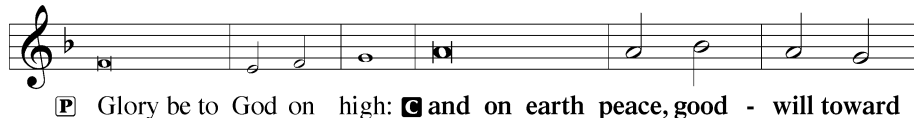

Installation of School Teachers and Staff

Those who are to begin service to the congregation are presented before the pastor. The pastor, standing before the altar if the rite is used in the church, announces the names of those who will be recognized and the duties that they will assume. He may greet each one individually with a handshake. The pastor addresses the worker(s):

- P** Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, you are to serve our Lord as (a) [name of service or position]. Hear what Holy Scripture has to say about those who serve in the Church:
- A** ³For by the grace given to me I say to everyone among you not to think of himself more highly than he ought to think, but to think with sober judgment, each according to the measure of faith that God has assigned. ⁴For as in one body we have many members, and the members do not all have the same function, ⁵so we, though many, are one body in Christ, and individually members one of another. ⁶Having gifts that differ according to the grace given to us, let us use them: if prophecy, in proportion to our faith; ⁷if service, in our serving; the one who teaches, in his teaching; ⁸the one who exhorts, in his exhortation; the one who contributes, in generosity; the one who leads, with zeal; the one who does acts of mercy, with cheerfulness.
- A** ¹⁵And let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, to which indeed you were called in one body. And be thankful. ¹⁶Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly, teaching and admonishing one another in all wisdom, singing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, with thankfulness in your hearts to God. ¹⁷And whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him.

- P** In the presence of God and of this [congregation/assembly], I install you (as [title of position]) in the name of the Father and of the ✠ Son and of the Holy Spirit.
- C** Amen.

- P** Go in the name of the Lord. Be steadfast, immovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, knowing that in the Lord your labor is not in vain. The almighty and most merciful God, the Father, the ✠ Son, and the Holy Spirit, bless and preserve you.

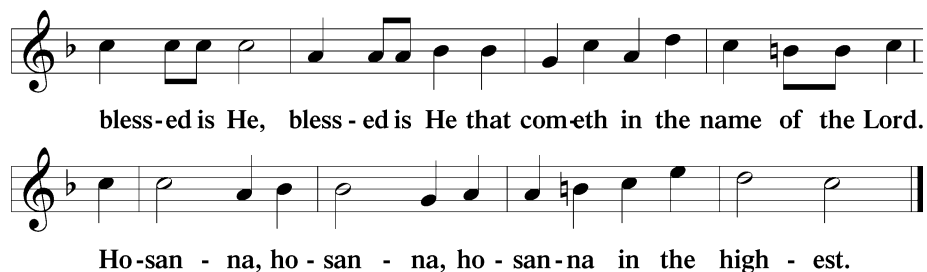

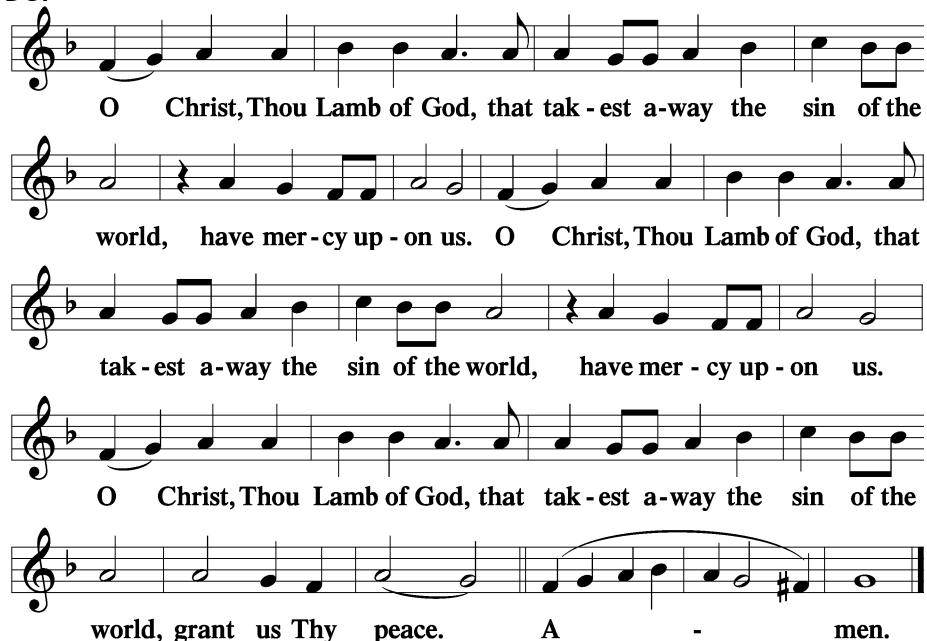


