If anyone else thinks he has reason for confidence in the flesh, I have more: <sup>5</sup>circumcised on the eighth day, of the people of Israel, of the tribe of Benjamin, a Hebrew of Hebrews; as to the law, a Pharisee; <sup>6</sup>as to zeal, a persecutor of the church; as to righteousness, under the law blameless. <sup>7</sup>But whatever gain I had, I counted as loss for the sake of Christ. <sup>8</sup>Indeed, I count everything as loss because of the surpassing worth of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord. But one thing I do: forgetting what lies behind and straining forward to what lies ahead, <sup>14</sup>I press on toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus.

<sup>33</sup>[Jesus said:] "Hear another parable. <sup>45</sup>When the chief priests and the Pharisees heard his parables, they perceived that he was speaking about them. <sup>46</sup>And although they were seeking to arrest him, they feared the crowds, because they held him to be a prophet.

#### Dear St. Paul's Families.

Sunday School is back!! We are very excited to have children back to in-person Sunday School to help them grow in their faith and knowledge of all the wonderful bible stories that Christ shares with us through His Word. Sunday School plans to reopen the weekend of October 11th and will be held following the 9am service (most likely starting around 10:30am and lasting for about an hour). We understand the concerns that have been brought forward with reopening Sunday School, but are confident in the plan/procedures we will have in place as well as having faith that God will provide for us during this time. Please read through the plan we have created as it is printed below. If you choose to send your child(ren) to Sunday School, be sure to sign up through the church's signup form for the services so that we know how many students to expect. Thank you!!

### **Sunday School Reopening Plan**

- Sunday School will begin at 10:30 and end no later than 11:30am.
- Parents may not enter the school building. In order to lessen contact as well as bodies in the building, only the students will be allowed to enter into the school to head to the gym for Sunday School.
- Students may enter through 1 of 2 entrances. The front doors to the school OR the church narthex. Before a student enters the school, their temperature will be taken.
- On or before the first time attending Sunday School, parents will need to sign a covid form stating that, when sending their child to Sunday School, their child is not exhibiting any covid symptoms, nor have they been around a positive case of covid-19. (If your child attends St. Paul's Lutheran School, you have already signed this form and are complying by the same standards that the school has. You do not have to sign another form.)
- Tables will be set up in the gymnasium. 2 students will sit per rectangular table, and 3 students per round table. At this time, we plan on all staying in the gymnasium, but plan on sitting in groups according to grade level/age.
- Sunday school groups include:
  - o PK 3 2nd grade
  - o 3rd-5th grade
  - o 6th-8th grade
  - High school/college/young adult
- Tables and chairs will be disinfected at the conclusion of Sunday school.
- A Sunday School offering will be collected very similar to church offering. Children can place their offering in a basket as they enter the gymnasium.

We ask for your prayers as we begin to navigate this new normal, and we look forward to having kids back in church, learning about their loving Savior.
